Marcelle I. Cedars, MD is the newly elected President of the American Society for Reproductive Medicine (ASRM) and Director of the University California San Francisco (UCSF) Center for Reproductive Health, and is a clinical specialist in the fields of in vitro fertilization,

perimenopause and polycystic ovarian ovary syndrome (PCOS). Dr. Cedars is a graduate of Wellesley College (a Wellesley Scholar with Honors in Philosophy). She received her medical training at the University of Texas Southwestern School of Medicine, completed her residency in obstetrics and gynecology at Parkland Memorial Hospital in Dallas, and her fellowship in reproductive endocrinology at UCLA.

As Director of the Division of Reproductive Endocrinology, Dr. Cedars coordinates the relationship between science and research conducted at UCSF along with personalized care for medical center patients. She is also the UCSF

Vice Chair for Clinical Affairs and the Director of the IVF Program in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology. Dr. Cedars is a member of the Board of the American Society of Reproductive Medicine (ASRM), Past President of the Society of Reproductive Endocrinology and Infertility, and former Clinical Director of the Executive Committee of the Society for Assisted Reproductive Technology (SART).

In addition, Dr. Cedars continues a long and distinguished career as a clinical investigator. She has published >100 peer-reviewed articles in the field of reproductive endocrinology and women's health. She has been awarded multiple grants including several NIH-NICHD (National Institute of Child Health and Human Development) RO1 grants in the area of ovarian aging. She and her team have assembled one of the largest cohorts of women in the world, which she has followed longitudinally to better understand ovarian aging. These roles bring a unique perspective in which to address the clinical conundrum of ovarian aging and in reversing the ravages of age on infertility treatment success.
